<b>Purpose of the Internship</b>	The knowledge, skills and attitudes gained by interns during the basic period and clinical training periods integrated with the clinic are evaluated in emergency health. to ensure that they can apply the service in their presentation areas.
<b>Learning Objectives of the Internship</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. He takes anamnesis from emergency patients.</li> <li>2. Performs a systemic physical examination.</li> <li>3. According to the results of the anamnesis and physical examination, it determines the pathological symptoms and signs, creates preliminary diagnoses and the basic diagnosis. He asks for his tests.</li> <li>4. Interpret the results of basic biochemical, hematologic and urine examinations.</li> <li>5. Makes a differential diagnosis by evaluating the anamnesis, physical examination findings and the results of basic diagnostic tests together and determines the further examinations required to make a definitive diagnosis.</li> <li>6. Knows the principles of multidisciplinary approach in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases and requests the necessary consultations.</li> <li>7. It organizes patients' medical records (patient files, epicrisis, etc.).</li> <li>8. Common diseases in the community (cardiovascular, diabetes, hypertension, kidney diseases, infectious diseases, old age diseases, malignancies and recommended screening tests), risk factors, informs individuals and the society about their prevention.</li> <li>9. Performs teamwork with physicians and other health personnel.</li> <li>10. Communicates effectively with the patient, their relatives and other healthcare personnel.</li> <li>11. Conduct literature review in order to update their medical knowledge and meet their learning needs, critically evaluate and present the findings of the literature.</li> <li>12. Performs diagnostic and interventional applications (IV and IM injection, venous and arterial blood sampling, vascular access, nasogastric catheter and urethral catheter insertion, urine, blood and throat culture, catheter care and dressing) under supervision.</li> <li>13. Monitors and evaluates the condition of critically ill patients (vital and clinical signs, laboratory results).</li> <li>14. Recognizes emergency clinical manifestations, monitors clinical and laboratory findings, and performs the necessary emergency intervention.</li> <li>15. <b>Assessment of Internship-Evaluation Method</b>	The practices in the intern report card are evaluated by the responsible instructors and the Head of the Department according to the criteria of attitudes and behaviors to be exhibited.

**Work of the Internship  
Terms/Rules**

1. The units of study and the rotation schedule are determined before the internship starts.
2. Orientation training is given to the interns at the specified time one day before the program starts.
3. Interns are ready in their work units at the beginning of working hours.
4. Emergency department workers alternate in three areas: triage, trauma and resuscitation, and follow-up.
5. Interns participate in handover visits, obtain and present the necessary information about patients.
6. He is responsible for assisting in the monitoring of patients admitted to the emergency department from arrival to discharge.
7. Performs the first examination for the preliminary diagnosis of the patient who is taken to the care units. Records the anamnesis and vital signs in the file.
8. Works together with the physician on duty in the stabilization and medical care of patients who are admitted to triage, resuscitation and monitored observation departments.
9. Exchanges opinions with the physician on duty about the examinations that may be required for the patient, after the approval of the physician on duty  
Makes the requests for the examinations.
10. It does not ask for consultation, it ensures that the consultation documents are arranged.
11. Patients who are decided to be kept under observation in the emergency department; It ensures that the vital signs of the patient are followed,  
It cooperates with the physician on duty in the planning of treatment and emergency care, and assists in interventions under the supervision of the physician on duty.
12. The department participates in the Intern Training Program.
13. It fully complies with the working principles of the hospital and the department, completes its work on time, ensures the order and order of the place where it works, and protects the materials it uses.
14. Establishes good relations with the hospital and department employees and carries out their duties in cooperation and harmony.
15. Reads the legislation and principles related to his/her duty in the hospital and the department he/she works in, complies with them completely, and ensures their implementation.
16. During working hours, he always wears his work clothes and carries his badges visibly. He takes care that his clothes are clean.
17. On-call intantes are on duty during their 12-hour shifts and do not sleep during their shift.
18. They do not leave the place of duty without permission and without the transfer of the guard. Seizure transfers are made under the supervision of the physician on duty.
19. When a change of shift or leave is requested, the signatures of both interns who will change the shift and the permission and approval (signature) of the physicians on duty on the day to be changed are obtained. This exchange document is submitted to the Department Secretariat.
20. Interns use the on-call physician rooms clean and tidy. From the clean use of the dressing lockers provided to them and they are responsible for delivering it in the same way to the intons that will come after them.
